


FIRST and ONLY EDITION? Concerns the construction of a dock at Villa Franca do Campo, São Miguel, a favorite project of the author, who never saw it to completion. Garcia d'Abranches (1769-1845), whom Innocêncio believed to be a native of S. Miguel, but was probably born at Ceia, district of Guarda, later became a naturalized Brazilian. He did spend several years on the Island of São Miguel in the Azores from 1830. In 1789 he had emigrated to Brazil, settling at São Luís de Maranhão. Between 1825 and 1830 he published and edited there the *Censor Maranhense*, defending the Emperor D. Pedro I in opposition to the newspapers of Odorico Mendes.

At the end are tables on exports, expenses at local hospitals, school attendance, the height above sea level of various locations on the island, etc. The map shows geographical features and towns; the 35 lithographs (signed "Serrano" or "S") are views of towns, of government and religious buildings and of costumes. There is a large folding lithograph panorama of the waterfront of Ponta Delgada, as viewed from the sea.

cm.); and a plan of the hot springs in the Valle das Furnas (36.7×45.8 cm.). The first was prepared by Lieutenant Colonel José Carlos de Figueiredo in 1824, while the two plans were prepared by the authors in 1825.

Mousinho de Albuquerque (1792-1846), became a colonel in the army engineering corps, Provador da Casa da Moeda (where he lectured on physics and chemistry), Governor of Madeira, Inspector of Public Works, deputy in various legislatures, and minister in several constitutional governments. An active proponent of the liberal cause, he died at Torres Vedras of a bullet wound in the Lutas da Patuleia. A member of the Academia Real das Sciencias de Lisboa, his textbook *Curso elementar de física e química* (5 volumes, Lisbon 1824) is said to be the first such complete work in Portuguese, while *Ideas sobre o estabelecimento da instrucção publica* (Paris 1823) was a comprehensive plan for university reform.





FIRST in book form of this valuable compendium of information on Ilha Terceira. A second edition appeared in 2019. The several dozen short articles, arranged in alphabetical order, include histories of the various religious and secular institutions; historical and descriptive notes on notable churches, buildings, cemeteries (including a Jewish cemetery), public areas and monuments; descriptions of religious and secular festivals; a list of foreign consuls then in residence; notes on libraries and printing establishments; biographies of some native Azorians who held titles of nobility; and accounts of royal visits to the Azores.

Costa Junior (1817-1887), a native of Angra, was a member of the Junta Geral for his district and also a provisional counsel. He owned and edited the journal *Insulano*, in which these articles first appeared, and published several other historical and biographical works.



FIRST EDITION of this comprehensive survey, island by island, of the natural history of the Azores. It includes information on whales. A second edition appeared in Lisbon, 1871.

The author was a surgeon, graduate of the Lisbon Medical School, journalist and a native of Angra do Heroismo (1834-Lisbon, 1892). He became a high ranking military surgeon, and was a corresponding member of the Academia Real das Sciencias de Lisboa as well as other scientific entities both Portuguese and foreign. As a journalist he favored liberal causes, even suffering some political persecution, to the extent of being imprisoned for a time in the Castelo São Jorge.



FIRST and ONLY EDITION of these five sonnets celebrating the aerial voyage of Gago Coutinho and Sacadura Cabral. In the spring of 1922 two of Portugal's most noted aviators, Sacadura Cabral and Gago Coutinho, made the first flight from Europe to South America, flying from Lisbon to Rio de Janeiro via the Canaries and Cabo Verde. It was the first long-distance flight in which rigorous methods of aerial navigation were used.



FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Among those eulogized are the Infante D. Fernando (son of D. João I), Henry the Navigator (another son of the same king), Nuno Alvares Pereira, Vasco da Gama, Affonso d'Albuquerque, D. Francisco d'Almeida, D. João de Castro, Duarte Pacheco Pereira, Luís de Camões, Frei Bartholomeu dos Martyres and the Marquês de Pombal. There are also "elogios" to various subjects, such as Eloquence, Poetry, Philosophy, the Liberal Arts and Geography, as well as discourses on "vantagens sobre animaes", the origin of the world, "as producções dos tres Reinos da Naturaza", the merit of artificial logic, the excelence and utility of rhetoric, the utility of arts and sciences, utility of history, and the most brilliant epochs of Portuguese history.

Frei Jerónimo Emiliano de Andrade (Angra, 1789-Angra do Heroísmo, 1847), was Comissário dos estuos in Angra do Heroísmo and the first reitor of the Liceu Nacional de Angra do Heroísmo. Abandoned as an infant, father unknown, he was taken under the care and provided an education by Father José de Andrade, entering the Franciscan Order aged 16. Early in his career as a teacher one of his students was Almeida Garrett. Influenced by the events of the Peninsular War, he became a partisan of the liberal revolution of 1820. He wrote a number of books and pamphlets. After 1834, with the suppression of the religious orders, he became a secular priest.



FIRST EDITION, rare. Written in the form of 100 cartas, or chapters, this correspondence from husband to wife discusses the history, customs, and present state of India (especially Calcutta), Macao, and China, based on the author's travels there and on his wide-ranging reading. Particular emphasis is given to the history of Portuguese discoveries, settlement and trade in the Far East, Chinese dynastic history, Chinese social life, culture, and institutions, tea, and Portugal's long rivalry with England in Asian commerce and colonial affairs. The lithograph plates include portraits of Chinese emperors and some of Andrade's Chinese friends, and portraits of the author and his wife after works by the noted Portuguese painter Domingos António de Sequeira (1768-1837). The Cartas opens and closes with two commendatory poems by Andrade's friend Francisco Antonio Martins Bastos, sometime poet, professor of Latin, and translator of much Latin poetry into Portuguese.

José Ignacio de Andrade, born on the Island of Sancta Maria in the Azores in 1780, devoted his life to overseas commerce, making numerous voyages to India and China. After many years he became a director of the Bank of Portugal and the Bank of Lisbon. This first edition was distributed only to his friends, and is rare. A second, fairly common edition, also with 12 lithograph portraits and with many corrections and additions, came from the same press in 1847 and is as elegant as the first.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Accounts, expenditures and ownership lists of the Santa Casa da Misericordia in Angra for the years 1833 to 1836. This *Manifesto* was prepared as a result of the important reforms enacted in the Azores in 1832.

The Santa Casa da Misericordia (Holy House of Mercy) is a uniquely Portuguese Catholic charitable institution, founded in Lisbon in 1498 by Queen Leonor and still existing today. Eventually practically every Portuguese city had its Santa Casa da Misericordia, and the institution spread overseas to Goa, Macau, Bahia, etc. The Santa Casa's administrators (Irmãos) tackled duties that would today be the province of lawyers, accountants, hospital administrators, prison chaplains and chaperones. One of the Casa da Misericordia's functions was to make certain that every Christian received a proper burial.



The author recounts the effects of an earthquake that struck the Azores on July 9-10, 1757, and the tsunami that followed, which together caused the loss of 1,200 lives. The island of São Jorge was hardest hit. Details are given of the destruction of many villages and the actions of Manuel Rodrigues Pereira and Bishop Valerio do Sacramento.

The 1757 earthquake was one of at least six major eruptions suffered by the volcanic Azores between 1580 and 1907. Online sources give the death toll in 1757 as 1,053 rather than 1,200.





Teófilo Braga (Joaquim Teófilo Fernandes Braga, 1843-1924), a native of Ponta Delgada in the Azores, published his first book of poetry at age 17 and an acclaimed book of verse, *Visão dos Tempos*, in 1864. The next year he was embroiled in the Questão Coimbra on the side of Antero de Quental and became notorious for his harsh criticism of Antonio Feliciano de Castilho. By 1872, having been awarded the chair of Modern Literature at the Curso Superior de Letras (today the Universidade de Lisboa), he turned most of his energy to literary research and criticism.

Braga's interests were wide ranging: he wrote extensively on Portuguese folklore and was highly influential in introducing sociology to Portugal. After the death of his children and his wife, he became involved in politics. For a brief time after the Revolution of 1910 he was president of the provisional government of the Republic, and in 1915, for a few months, succeeded Manuel de Arriaga as president of the Republic.





In the army he rose to the rank of reserve general. FIRST EDITION. Innocêncio points out that the notes, which begin on p. 175 and continue to the end of the volume, treat important historical, scientific, literary and critical

points. A second, augmented edition appeared in Lisbon, 1863; while a third edition appeared in 1906 as volumes XXIX to XXXII of Castilho's *Obras completas*.

Castilho (1800-75), a native of Lisbon, became blind at the age of six but nevertheless went on to earn a degree in law from Coimbra. Aside from his vast literary production, he invented a new method for teaching children to read, the "methodo portuguez," and attempted to implement it while serving as Commissario Geral de Instrucção Primaria. Castilho ranks (with Almeida Garrett and Herculano) as one of the three best Romantic writers in Portugal, and Bell notes that "His quadras ... and his blank verse are alike so easy and natural, his style so harmonious and pure that, despite the lack of observation and originality in these long poems, they have not even to-day lost their place in Portuguese literature." Castilho published numerous works of poetry and prose, founded and edited the Revista universal lisbonense (1841-45), and began the series "Livraria Classica Portuguesa," for which he wrote the studies of Bernardes and Garcia de Resende. He also translated works of Ovid, Molière, Anacreon and Goethe—his Faust translation is particularly well known for the controversy it raised among students of German language and literature ("a questão faustina"). Following Almeida Garrett's death and Herculano's retreat to Val-de-Lôbos, Castilho became the leading figure of the Romantic movement. His 1865 prologue to a work by Pinheiro Chagas, which condemned the young writers of Coimbra (Antero de Quental, Teofilo Braga, and Vieira de Castro) for "nebulosidade," incited Quental to write Bom senso e bom gôsto, thus sparking one of the greatest polemics in the history of Portuguese literature.



First edition in German; originally published in Genoa, 1585 as *Dell' unione del regno di Portogallo alla corona di Castiglia*. The text appears to be much more extensive than the original and later editions in other languages. This is one of the key accounts of the fatal campaign of D. Sebastião in Africa (f. 5v-38v) in 1578, and of the subsequent events that culminated in Philip II of Spain gaining the throne of Portugal. The Portuguese overseas possessions, including Cabo Verde, Malabar, Goa, Malacca and Brazil, are mentioned briefly on f. 4r, as is Christopher Columbus. At first this book was considered pro-Spanish, but Philip II of Spain tried to have it suppressed. The work is now considered to be a reasonably objective account of the realpolitik of Philip II's ascent to the Portuguese crown. It was something of a sensation in its time. Six Italian editions are known between 1585 and 1642, the present single edition in German, six editions in French, one in English (1600), one in Spanish (1610) and two in Latin. Most, if not all of these, save the present one, are without illustrations. Conestagio's somewhat disguised aversion to Spain's political aspirations is even more evident in his subsequent work on the wars in the Low Countries.


One very large folding engraving shows the disposition of D. Sebastião's troops (at Alcácer Quibir?), while the second shows the fierce naval battle off the Island of Terceira in the Azores that involved English and French as well as Spanish and Portuguese ships, when the aspirations of D. Antonio, Prior of Crato to the Portuguese throne were decisively crushed. The half-page woodcut on the second f. 102v shows executions by hanging and beheading. On the second leaf 126 verso, facing the colophon leaf, is a large finely executed woodcut printer's device. The second leaf verso contains woodcut portraits of Holy Roman Emperor Rudolph II, King Philip II of Spain, Archduke Charles II Francis of Austria and Archduke Ferdinand II of Austria.

Many bibliographers have attributed the work to the Spanish-born D. Juan de Silva, 4.° Conde de Portalegre (title inherited through his Portuguese wife's grandfather, with the permission of King Philip.) Today it is generally believed instead to be the work of Conestagio; see, for example, Brooks in *A King for Portugal*. See also Queiroz Velloso, *D. Sebastião*, 1554-1578 (1945) p. 315 n. 28, and Merriman, *The Rise of the Spanish Empire in the Old World and in the New*, IV, 404.

Girolamo Franchi di Conestagio (Genoa, 1530-Flanders [Antwerp?] 1616-1617?) was a Genoese merchant, diplomat, historian and scholar. A nobleman, he spent considerable time on business in Antwerp. His *Historia delle guerre de Germania Inferiore* (Venice, 1614), on the Dutch Revolt, drew on sources written from the rebel point of view, and was criticised by Luis Cabrera de Córdoba as inaccurate. He participated in the Accademia dei



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Confusi, a literary circle, headed by Stefano Ambrogio Schiappalaria. In 1576 Conestagio moved to Lisbon, probably due to events in the Low Countries. There he represented Genoese interests at the customs house of that city. At the Portuguese capital he maintained friendly relations with Philip II's ambassador, Juan de Silva (1528-1601). He also knew the Portuguese King, D. Sebastião. He was in Lisbon in 1580, when Philip II succeeded in ascending to the Portuguese throne, and thus was an eye witness to many of the events described in his book. While we do not know exactly how long he remained in Portugal, he was still there in 1584, when he obtained the right to use his coat-of-arms there, probably as a result of some service to the crown. By 1590 Conestagio was Genoese consul in Venice. His final years were passed in Flanders.

The author's *Appendice ao compendio da historia portugueza*, Rio de Janeiro [on verso of title page: Typographia Americana de I.P. da Costa], 1834, is rare, and does not appear with this *Compendio*. On the verso of the half title of the *Compendio* is the statement "Cada exemplar levará a firma do auctor; e elle prottest contra qualquer falsificação." The present copy contains the author's signature.

The author (1800-1844), a native of Ilha Terceira in the Azores, fled to England during the Portuguese civil wars in the 1820s, and from there went to teach in Rio de Janeiro. In failing health he returned to Portugal, but there fell hopelessly in love with a woman far above his social station. He set out for the Azores in an attempt to forget her, but died, still despondent, not long after his arrival. Craveiro also published translations of works by Racine, Voltaire, Rousseau and Byron, and wrote a thoughtful essay on whether the form of tragedy could legitimately be changed from that created by the Greeks.

FIRST EDITION? Another appeared in Lisbon, 1845. Innocêncio mentions an earlier edition of Rio de Janeiro, but does not give a date; we have not found any references to actual copies of such an edition.

The *Ensaio* deals with the moral and philosophical aims of tragedy, and whether the form of tragedy can be legitimately changed from that created by the ancient Greeks.

The author (1800-1844), a native of Ilha Terceira in the Azores, fled to England during the Portuguese civil wars in the 1820s and from there went to teach in Rio de Janeiro. In failing health he returned to Portugal, only to fall hopelessly in love with a woman far above his social station. He set out for the Azores in an attempt to forget her, but died, still despondent, not long after his arrival. Craveiro also wrote a history of Portugal and translated works of Racine, Voltaire, Rousseau and Byron.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. In 723 hendecasyllabic verses, the author discusses public hygiene and ways to improve it, in Portugal and particularly Lisbon. It makes for a fascinating read. For example, he advises Portuguese women to bathe rather than using heavy perfumes:

Damas Francezas, desterrai perfumes

Que tão caros vendeis á insania alheia;

Do Tejo as Nynphas tem do patrio rio

Os crystaes, que banhar seus membros devem.

Vicente Pedro Nolasco da Cunha (1773-1844), a native of Caldas da Rainha, studied medicine and philosophy at Coimbra. Poet and member of the Conservatório Real de Lisboa, translator and man of enormous cultural achievement, he was a leader of one of Lisbon's Masonic lodges. Despite liberal tendencies which had caused him to become suspect by the government of the Prince Regent D. João in the early 1800s, he displayed great courage and patriotism, offering a toast in favor of the Prince and the House of Bragançajust after the French invasion, in June 1808. When this became known to Junot, he

was forced to flee to England. In London he collaborated with Bernardo José de Abrantes e Castro in the founding of the *Investigador português*. In 1814 he accompanied the future Duke of Palmela to represent Portugal at the Congress of Vienna.

João Bernardo da Rocha Loureiro (Guarda, 1778-1853, Lisbon), at odds with the Portuguese government, fled to England in 1812, where he helped publish *O Espelho* and founded *O Portuguez*, which called for reforms in the Portuguese government. After the Revolution of 1820 he was invited back to Portugal as *chronista-mor*. Elected to the Cortês in 1823, he was once again at odds with the government: Innocêncio notes, "Mostrou sempre uma notavel coherencia de principios e doutrinas politicas, da qual não será facil apontar muitos exemplos." Soon he again fled to England. There he remained until 1836, after he was re-appointed *chronista-mor* and elected deputy to the Côrtes. Dissatisfied with the vicissitudes of the Portuguese Constitution in the 1840s, Rocha Loureiro fled to Madrid. He returned in 1851, poor and ill, and died not long after.

The author (Tavira 1792-1881) was a decorated veteran of the Peninsular War. In 1828 he was an army captain stationed on the Island of Terceira when the army proclaimed the restoration of the constitutional government on 22 June, annulling the act of acclamation

in favor of D. Miguel of 16 May that year. He was promoted to major shortly thereafter, receiving the title Barão do Monte Brazil in 1862, and rising to general of division in 1865.

FIRST EDITION. An attractive set of this important work on the history of Terceira from its discovery by the Portuguese through 1832; at the end of each volume are reprinted numerous documents. The author was a native of São Sebastião, Ilha Terceira. A facsimile reprint appeared in 1981.

Francisco Ferreira Drummond (Vila de São Sebastião, 1796-Vila de São Sebastião, 1858) was a historian, paleographer, musician and politican figure. This is his principal work. It has occupied an important place in the historiography of the Azores in general, and the Island of Terceira in particular, serving as a base for more recent historical studies. As a liberal, Drummond suffered political persecution after the Vila-Francada (1823), fleeing Terceira, only able to return after the Abrilada (1824). He participated actively on the liberal side during the 1828-1834 civil war; some of his actions are related in the *Annaes*.

Provenance: Aníbal [or Annibal] Fernandes Thomáz [or Tomás], 1849-1911. Writer, government official, and distinguished bibliophile, he was also a collector of ex-libris,

super-libris, rare books, and prints. Fernandes Thomaz was born in Figueira-da-Foz and served as a postal inspector in Lisbon, as well as in other government posts. Concurrently he formed an outstanding library of books and prints and published prolifically on bibliographical and historical topics. His writings include works on Camões, Portuguese bookplates, Portuguese super-libris, Portuguese engravers, and engraved and lithographic portraits. His library was sold at auction in 1912; the catalogue is one of the most important for Portuguese books. Apparently purchased at the 1912 sale by Luís Felipe de Andrade Albuquerque Bettencourt (1876-?).

Third edition of the author's most important work, which first appeared in Lisbon, 1655, with a second edition of Lisbon, 1740.

The *Noticias* includes eight discourses: (1) on increasing the population of Portugal, (2) on improving the military organization of the kingdom, (3) the origins and coats-of-arms of Portuguese nobility, (4) Portuguese coinage, (5) the development of universities in the Iberian Peninsula in general, and Portugal in particular, (6) the evangelization of Guiné, (7) the causes of shipwrecks on the *carreira da India*, and (8) travel. A final section includes eulogies of Portuguese cardinals.

The first discourse (I, 1-69) is an appeal for increasing the population of Portugal. Severim de Faria argues that a large population will promote industry and agriculture, and provide men for the army, navy and merchant marine. He cites China, whose large population provides manpower for industry and agriculture. Germany, Flanders, England and Italy are also cited as positive examples. As a counter-example he cites the kingdom of Granada, which declined after its Moorish population was expelled. In this discourse, Severim de Faria also mentions the Azores, Madeira, Angola, Mozambique, Brazil, Cabo Verde, São Tomé, Goa, Diu, Cochim, Colombo, the Malucas, Ormuz, Malaca and Mascate.

The second discourse (I, 70-177) is a sweeping analysis of the military organization of Portugal from historical and contemporary points of view. Severim de Faria's topics include the role of the king, constable, and other officers, the composition of the army, military law, and the traditional hostility between Portugal and Castile. In discussing ordinance and armaments, he considers problems of supply in continental Portugal, Funchal, Ponta Delgada, Angra, Ribeira Grande in Cabo Verde, São Tomé, Salvador da Bahia, Olinda, and Rio de Janeiro. Also discussed are fortresses and the defense of the frontiers, the navy, the office of admiral, and composition of the fleets, including their deployment in Africa, India and Brazil and the problems of North African and French pirates. A section on the arming of merchant ships mentions São Tomé, Brazil, Flanders, and the Companhia da Bolsa do Brasil. The final part of this discourse (I, 163-177) deals with the military orders of Avis, Santiago, Christ (successor to the Templars in Portugal), and the Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem.

The third discourse (I, 178-318) deals with the noble families of Portugal: their antiquity, and the origin of their names, titles, and coats of arms.

The fourth discourse (II, 1-106) is on coinage, beginning with Roman coins that circulated in the province of Lusitania and continuing with the coinage of Visigothic kings and Arabs. The coinage of the kings of Portugal is covered from Dom Sancho I (the first king known with certainty to have operated a mint) to Dom João IV. Notably absent is the coinage of the Spanish monarchs D. Filipe II, III, and IV, who ruled Portugal as D.

Filipe I, II, and III. Subsequent editors added comments on the coinage of D. João IV's successors through D. Maria I.

Illustrations for the discourse on coinage vary from edition to edition. The 1655 edition of the *Noticias* has engravings within the text (pp. 151-191) that illustrate the recto and verso of 15 coins. The latest is a coin issued under D. João IV (r. 1640-1656) whose verso bears an image of N. Senhora da Conceição and the inscription "Tutelaris Regni". The 1741 edition has 18 images of coins within the text (pp. 146-186): the three additions date to 1695, 1726, and 1733. In our 1791 edition, the 18 illustrations have been shifted to four engraved plates. Although text was added to cover coins minted under D. José I and D. Maria I, the text makes no references to additional illustrations. Hence we assume Innocêncio's call for five engraved plates in this edition is in error.

The fifth discourse (II, 106-143) begins with an essay on the universities of Spain, then discusses the study of science in Portugal and goes on to brief mentions of the universities at Coimbra, Évora, Salamanca, Toledo, Siguença, Alcalá de Henares, Osma, Ávila, Valladolid, Oropesa, Ossuna, Sevilla, Granada, Baeça, Murcia, Santiago de Compostela, Onhate, Oviedo, Huesca, Zaragoza, Lerida, Perpignan, Barcelona, Tarragona, Girona, Valencia, Luchente, Origuela, Gandia, Hirache, Estella, and Pamplona. Some of these became highly respected institutions; others were established but achieved little.

The sixth discourse (II, 143-177) is titled "Sobre a propagaçam do evangelho nas Provincias de Guiné". Severim de Faria mentions not only Guiné but Cabo Verde, Goa, the Congo, Luanda, Cacheu, Mina, São Tomé, and Sierra Leão. Also included are brief references to martyrs in Japan, China, Siam, India, "Cafraria" (i.e., Southeast Africa), and Brazil.

The seventh discourse (II, 178-193) considers why so many ships returning to Portugal from India were wrecked, mentioning the famous account of João Baptista Lavanha on the São Alberto. Severim de Faria points out the superiority of English and Dutch vessels, noting that at this time, the Dutch were waging war against Portugal in India and Brazil.

The eighth discourse (II, 193-215) discusses when and where travel can be beneficial. The *Noticias* ends with eulogies of twenty Portuguese who achieved the rank of cardinal in the Catholic Church (II, 215-296).

Severim de Faria (1583-1655), a native of Lisbon, is best known for this work and his *Discursos varios politicos*, Évora 1624. His *Relação universal do que succedeu em Portugal* ..., Lisbon 1626, is considered the first periodical published in Portugal, and includes a famous account of the loss and reconquest of Bahia. Severim de Faria was Resende's successor in archeology, and his fame came to rival that of his uncle; he also collected a choice library of rare books. Innocêncio describes Severim de Faria as "um escriptor geralmente respeitavel, e que nas suas obras deixou muito bons subsidios para a historia civil, não menos que para a da litteratura, da lingua, e da critica litteraria em Portugal. A sua dicção e geralmente pura e fluente"

The main part of the book is made up of eight discourses: (1) on the population of Portugal, (2) the military organization of the kingdom, (3) the nobility, (4) a history of its coinage, going back to the Roman times, (5) the universities and sciences in the Iberian Peninsula in general, and in Portugal in particular, (6) the evangelization of Guiné, (7) the causes of shipwrecks, and (8) a miscellaneous section on travel, Portuguese cardinals, eulogies, etc.

The first discourse (pp. 1-33) is an appeal for increasing the population of Portugal. It is argued that a large population is needed to promote industry and agriculture, as well as to man the army, navy and merchant marine. Comparisons are made to China, which is said to be able to sustain a large population, and to use the manpower to increase industry and agriculture. Germany, Flanders, England and Italy are also cited as positive examples. The kingdom of Grenada is given as a bad example, having declined after the expulsion of its Moorish population. There are references to the Azores, Madeira, Angola, Mozambique, Brazil, Cabo Verde, São Tomé, Goa, Diu, Cochim, Colombo, the Malucas, Ormuz, Malaca and Mascate.

The second discourse (pp. 34-84) is a sweeping analysis of the military organization of Portugal. It deals with the role of the king, of the constable, and of other officers, both from an historical perspective as well as the practices of the day. Composition of the army is discussed, as is military law, and the traditional hostility between Portugal and Castile. Ordinance and armaments are described, including the role in supply of various



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places in continental Portugal, as well as Funchal, Ponta Delgada, Angra, Ribeira Grande in Cabo Verde, the Island of São Tomé, Salvador da Bahia, Olinda, and Rio de Janeiro. Fortresses and defense of the frontiers is discussed. There is a section on the navy, the office of Admiral, and a part on the composition of the fleets, including their deployment in Africa, India and Brazil. North African and French pirates are mentioned. A section on the arming of merchant ships includes mention of São Tomé, Brazil, and Flanders. There is also a reference in this section to the Companhia da Bolsa do Brasil. The final part of this discourse (pp. 77-84) deals with the military orders of Avis, Santiago, Christ (successor to the Templars in Portugal), and the Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem.

The third discourse (pp. 85-149) deals with the noble families of Portugal. It discusses their antiquity, the origin of names, coats-of-arms, and titles of nobility.

Severim de Faria (1583-1655), a native of Lisbon, is best known for this work and his *Discursos varios politicos*, Évora 1624. His *Relação universal do que succedeu em Portugal ...*, Lisbon 1626, is considered the first periodical published in Portugal, and includes a famous account of the loss and reconquest of Bahia. Severim de Faria was Resende's successor in archeology, and his fame came to rival that of his uncle; he also collected a choice library of rare books. Innocêncio describes Severim de Faria as "um escriptor geralmente respeitavel, e que nas suas obras deixou muito bons subsidios para a historia civil, não menos que para a da litteratura, da lingua, e da critica litteraria em Portugal. A sua dicção e geralmente pura e fulente"

The fourth discourse (pp. 150-201) is about coinage, beginning with Roman coins current in the province of Lusitania. There are sections for Visigothic kings, and a brief treatise on Arab coins. The coinage of the kings of Portugal is covered, from Dom Sancho I, the first for whom there was incontrovertible proof that he operated a mint, to Dom João IV (with the notable exception of the Spanish monarchs D. Filipe II, III, and IV, who ruled Portugal as D. Filipe I, II, and III). There are fifteen fine engravings in the text, each showing the head and tail of a specific coin.


The fifth discourse (pp. 202-23) is titled "Sobre as universidades de Hespanha". It includes notices of Universities at Coimbra, Évora, Salamanca, Toledo, Siguença, Alcalá de Henares, Osma, Ávila, Valladolid, Oropesa, Ossuna, Sevilla, Granada, Baeça, Murcia, Santiago de Compostela, Onhate, Oviedo, Huesca, Zaragoza, Lerida, Perpignan, Barcelona, Tarragona, Girona, Valencia, Luchente, Origuela, Gandia, Hirache, Estella, and Pamplona. While some of these were active learned institutions, others were founded in principle, but never achieved much, or anything. There is a section on the beginnings of the sciences in Lusitania.

The sixth discourse (pp. 224-40) is titled "Sobre a propagaçam do evangelho nas Provincias de Guiné". It also includes notices regarding the nearby islands of Cabo Verde, as well as mention of Goa, the Congo, Luanda, Cacheu, Mina, São Tomé, and Sierra Leon. There is a brief reference to martyrs in Japan, China, Siam, India, "Cafraria" (i.e. Southeast Africa) and Brazil.

The seventh discourse (pp. 241-7) deals with the many shipwrecks which befell ships returning to Portugal from India. The famous account of João Baptista Lavanha on the *São Alberto* is noted, while the superiority of English, and especially Dutch vessels is emphasized. It is mentioned that these Dutch ships were waging war against Portugal in India and Brazil.

The eighth discourse (pp. 248-342) begins with a brief, rather abstract essay on travel. This is followed by a memorial to various Portuguese who achieved the rank of Cardinal in the Catholic Church (pp. 258-77), and a series of Eulogies, to Frey Bernardo de Brito (pp. 278-88), the city of Évora (pp. 289-90), and king Dom João III of Portugal (pp. 291-305). Finally, included in this discourse is a work by João de Barros, "Panegirico a mui Alta e esclarecida princesa Infanta Dona Maria nossa Senhora" (pp. 306-42).

FIRST EDITION of this immensely useful reference work, perhaps the most enduring among several of lasting significance by this author. It describes 1,994 books and pamphlets. Jorge César de Figanière e Morão (Rio de Janeiro, 1813-Lisbon, 1887 [according to the *Grande enciclopédia*] or 1888 [according to Sacramento Blake and Welsh), author, soldier and public servant, was the son of César Henrique de Figanière. He fought on the side of D. Pedro and D. Maria II during the *lutas liberais*, served in various positions in the Ministry of Foreign Relations, and wrote numerous books and articles.

FIRST [?] and ONLY [?] EDITION. Father Fonseca (1802-1869), a native of the Island of Terceira in the Azores, founded and edited 2 newspapers, *Iris da Terceira* and *Clarim*



terceirense, wrote for the newspaper Sentinela constitucional, taught Latin grammar at Angra do Heroísmo, and was Canon and Dean of the Angra cathedral. This pamphlet was issued to counter attacks on his character. The author published a work in 1844 which begins with the same two words, which we have not been able to see, but think it may be a different text. Ernesto do Canto, Bibliotheca açoriana, lists both, without calling this a second edition, and seeming to treat them as distinct works.

FIRST EDITION. Extremely rare. Of all the islands of the Azores, São Miguel is the most prone to volcanic eruptions and earthquakes; this work describes an eruption of September 1630, one of the worst in the seventeenth century. P. Antonio Fernandez Franco, vicar of the church of Alagoa on his native island of São Miguel, was an eyewitness and describes the event in vivid detail, from the first rumblings to the ash and pumice tossed into the air. Several villages were destroyed; the number of dead could not be reliably established. The Church organized processions of penitents, and the government freed petty criminals from jail. Innocêncio had seen only Barbosa Machado's reference to this work, and doubted its existence: "Nenhum dos nossos mais indagadores bibliographos que consultei, me dá noticia de ter visto esta Relação, nem de saber onde elle exista ou existisse" (I, 137). Nine years later (VIII, 142) he still had not seen a copy. Brito Aranha (XX, 211 and XXII, 265) knew of a single copy of this "rarissimo opusculo," found by Dr. Augusto Mendes Simões de Castro in a collection of pamphlets, and described by him in Archivo bibliographico da Biblioteca da Universidade de Coimbra, VIII:4, pp. 62-4. Brito Aranha also cites a Spanish translation of Valencia, 1630 (see Salvá 3374), and a French translation of Lisbon, 1630. There is also a Spanish edition of Baeza: por Pedro de la Cuesta, 1630 (see Iberian Books 42823). Ernesto do Canto had not seen a copy when he published his bibliography of the Azores in 1890, but noted that a copy was reputed to exist in the library of Joaquim José da Costa Macedo. In 1909 Eugénio do Canto published an edition of the work (limited to 60 copies) that included the Portuguese, Spanish and French versions.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Rather than dealing specifically with the important archive mentioned in the title, this work concentrates more on the importance of public archives in general. In 1854 the author was given by the Portuguese government the task of inspecting and planning the organizing of the nation's archives, giving rise to the present publication, which, according to José de Torres in his *História dos Açores*, can be considered the beginnings of modern historiography for the Azores.

FIRST EDITION. There exists a reprint, São Miguel: Câmara Municipal de Povoação, 1990. Records an expedition to S. Miguel's famous Valle das Furnas to study the natural phenomena (including geysers); with historical, geographical and scientific commentary. The text is nicely complemented by 3 dramatic illustrations of steaming *caldeiras*. The author traces the history of the Azores from the sixteenth century and describes the hot volcanic springs of the remarkable Furnas valley in São Miguel, its inhabitants and agriculture. He provides an analysis of the waters and describes the house and gardens of Thomas Hickling, the American consul whose father helped to popularize the islands, and which is illustrated with an engraving (p. 66).



FIRST and ONLY EDITION. The author was an eyewitness to the unsuccessful attack on Terceira by the Miguelistas: he was, in fact, in charge of the island's fortifications. This is an important account.

Euzebio Candido Cordeiro Pinheiro Furtado (Luanda, 1777-Lisbon, 1861) was a Portuguese army officer, eventually rising to the rank of Brigadier, exercising the functions of commander-in-chief of the army's engineers. He fought on the liberal side during the 1828-1834 Portuguese civil war.

Provenance: Romão José Soares, 1.º Barão de Cacilhas (Évora, 1787-Lisbon, 1844), army officer who fought in the Peninsular War. He rose from lieutenant in 1809 to captain,promoted for bravery during the battle of Pamplona in 1813. By 1820 he was a major. In 1828 he took part in the revolt against D. Miguel, commanding a battalion which

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was defeated, retreating to Galicia with his soldiers. Emigrating to England, he took part in the initial unsuccessful attempt to invade the Island of Terceira under general Saldanha, after which he sought refuge in France. For his part in the battle of Ponte Ferreira he was promoted to lieutenant-colonel and decorated with the Order of the Torre-e-Espada. Shortly afterwards promoted to full colonel, he took part in the expedition under the Duque de Terceira which invaded the Algarve, marching on Lisbon from the South. He took part in the defense of Lisbon in July 1833, and fought under Marshall Saldanha in the battles of Pernes and Almoster. Already a general in 1835 he was governer of Elvas, later governor of arms for the Alentejo. See *Nobreza de Portugal e do Brasil*, II, 457.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this account of how the Miguelistas were repelled from the Liberal stronghold of Ilha Terceira, which became the headquarters of D. Pedro's forces and of D. Maria II's Conselho de Regencia. Innocêncio notes that the *Memoria* is valuable as an eyewitness account: Furtado was at the time a lieutenant colonel of Engineers serving in the Azores.

In this work, written to counter a letter of João Bernardo Rocha Loureiro, Portugal's *cronista-mor*, Furtado reprints a letter he wrote to Rocha Loureiro as well as letters and decrees from the Conde de Vila Flor (later Duque de Terceira) and the Duque de Palmela. At the end are 5 large folding tables giving details of the actions, including the officers who disembarked with the Conde de Villa Flor at Vila da Praia on 22 June 1829, the status of the fortifications and who was commanding them, the troops at Villa Flor's disposal, the naval forces fighting for D. Miguel, and the distribution of troops on ships.

Furtado later rose to be *commandante geral* of the Engineers. He was born in 1777 in S. Paulo de Loanda, where his father, Luis Candido Cordeiro Pinheiro Furtado, was *marechal de campo*.



FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this little-known initial issue of a short-lived periodical written by Almeida Garrett in London, after he fled the rule of D. Miguel during the Lutas Liberaes. He returned to Portugal in 1832, marching on Porto with the Bravos de Mindelo led by D. Pedro IV. The present issue is a vehement appeal to all Portuguese to follow the lead of D. Pedro, the Duke of Bragança (formerly D. Pedro IV, King of Portugal, and before that D. Pedro I, Emperor of Brazil) against his brother the absolutist D. Miguel. It documents the gathering of troops in the Açores under the Conde de Vila Flor and gives a list of officers who had been taken prisoner, as well as a breakdown of the numbers of soldiers of various types (artillery of the line, caçadores, infantry, etc.) taken prisoner (1277) and of the "Força da columna expedicionaria constitucional" (1500).

Canto refers to the present issue as the first, followed by the one of 4 October (paginated 9-12) and one of 11 October (paginated 13-16).

The Visconde de Almeida Garrett (1799-1854) was a man of great talent and farreaching interests: "As journalist, founder and editor of several short-lived newspapers, as a stylist and master of prose, his country's chief lyric poet in the first half of the nineteenth century ... and greatest dramatist since the sixteenth; as politician and one of the most eloquent of all Portugal's orators, an enthusiastic if unscientific folk-lorist, a novelist, critic, diplomatist, soldier, jurist and judge, Almeida Garrett played many parts and with success" (Bell, *Portuguese Literature* pp. 288-89).



In 1832 Hodges commanded the brigade of British volunteers who enlisted to fight to restore the rightful Queen of Portugal, Maria da Glória, to her throne against the forces of the usurper, Dom Miguel. With the rest of the forces commanded by D. Maria's father Dom Pedro, the ex-Emperor of Brazil, they sailed from Terceira in the Azores, captured Oporto and endured a siege there of nearly a year. Hodges distinguished himself by his leadership, especially during the assault on the city by Miguel's army on 29 September 1832.

Mariano de Azevedo Itapura (São Paulo, 1864-Rio de Janeiro, 1889), an officer in the coast guard who served on the *Nichteroy*, the *Javary*, and the *Almirante Barrozo*, publishes his unedited letters to his brother. He mentions New Orleans, the Gulf of Mexico, Havana, Matanzas, New York, Newport, the Azores, Madeira, the Canary Islands, Cabo Verde, São Vicente. The last few pages describe a fire aboard an Austrian brig *Cori* in the harbor of Montevideo; for his valor in helping save those



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aboard, Itapura was commended and promoted. Includes a folding table of holidays for various nations, and a folding plate, in color, of flags for the provinces of Brazil.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this liberal hymn in favor of the proposed first Portuguese constitution, which was at the time in draft form; the final version was approved in

1822. The author's name appears on p. [3]. On p. 9, verse 30, it is mentioned that Madeira and the Açores had adhered to the new constitution, and in verse 31 on the same page it is said that Bahia, Pará, Pernambuco and Maranhão are on board. Conspicuously absent is any mention of favorable reaction on the part of Rio de Janeiro, São Paulo, or Minas Gerais. The unfavorable reaction of many of the Brazilian delegates to the constitutional Côrtes was one of the major causes of Brazilian Independence.

José Augusto Correa Leal (1794-1861), a native of Porto, was "Sub-director graduado da secretaria da Camara dos Deputados" of the Portuguese parliament. This and *Epicedio pela dolorosa occasião da Sentida e deplorada morte do Muito Alto e Muito Poderoso Senhor D. Pedro d'Alcantara, Duque de Brangança* (1834) appear to be his only separately published original works; he translated at least two others.

His services to the Island of Terceira in the Azores are mentioned on p. 14, and his granting Portugal its second constitution, the *Carta constitucional*, is also emphasized.

Father Vicente de Santa Rita was born in Lisbon, probably in 1776, and is said to have died in 1842 or shortly thereafter. Initially a member of the Franciscan order, he became a secular priest. During the period 1820-1823 he was a supporter of liberal doctrines, for which he suffered persecution afterwards, finally being imprisoned in 1830 under D. Miguel. He was liberated in 1833 along with other political prisoners.



FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this important work on the 1828 Revolution. The author, born in Porto, lived in Bahia as a merchant, serving as well as a Capitão de milicias and Vereador da Câmara until shortly after independence was declared, then returned to Portugal. In Bahia he published the *Seminário civico*, of which 117 numbers were said to have appeared from 1821 to June 5, 1823, and *A Sentinella Bahiense*, of which there were said to have been published 15 numbers from 21 June to 7 October 1823. From 1826 to 1828 he published in Porto *O imparcial*, defending the Carta Constitucional, but threatened with persecution, fled the country in 1828. In Rio de Janeiro his *Brasileiro imparcial*, published from 1830 to 1831 (when the author died), caused such ill feeling that his funeral ceremonies were disrupted by protesters.

This book appears to have been written in exile in England and Brazil between 1829 and Rio de Janeiro, December 4, 1830, the place and date of the author's preface. His son, the physician Emilio Joaquim da Silva Maia, a native of Bahia, wrote an introduction, addressed to the Instituto Histórico e Geográfico Brasileiro, dated May 19, 1841, followed by a preface in which he states that his father's manuscript came into his possession in 1834. Pages 347-63 constitute a list of subscribers.

According to Innocêncio, Mantua published a further defense, *Resposta aos folhetos anonymos* (not located in Porbase or OCLC).

Morgados were a form of entail, a long-standing legal device to keep large inheritances together, by using *vinculos* (metaphorical "chains") to ensure that parts of a large estate could not be dispersed. Usually the entire *morgado* passed to the eldest son. Those who argued in favor of the institution often did so on the grounds that to disperse *morgados* would be a violation of property rights.

FIRST EDITION. The text appeared again in the author's *Obras completas*, [1987?], where it was included in his "Escritos patrióticos". While there may be some subtle connection to patriotism or politics, the work appears to follow its title, dealing with an overview of cosmological and geographical knowledge from an historical point of view. There are chapters on the Earth, stars, planets, the solar system, celestial physics, movement of the Earth, comets, Buffon's theory of the formation of planets, other theories regarding the formation of planets, the shape and size of Earth, other geological considerations about the terrestrial globe, volcanic phenomena, on the origins and causes of subterranean fires and earthquakes, geography of volcanos, volcanos of the Açores (2 chapters), islands formed by volcanos and the so-call Altantis, some memorable earthquakes, meteorites, iron, and other substances which fall to Earth through the atmosphere, a catalogue of falling stones, iron, and other meteoric material, and finally general considerations about fluids which form part of the otherwise solid terrestrial globe.

José Accursio das Neves (1766-1834), a noted economist, held various government posts; his writing was primarily concerned with the political implications of commerce. Elected a member of the Real Academia das Sciencias de Lisboa in 1810, he was a defender of absolutism, being one of the principle supporters of D. Miguel in the Côrtes of 1828. As an absolutist, he had been opposed to the liberal ideology behind the revolution of 1820, and the 1822 constitution. On May 14, 1821 he lost his government offices, only to be reinstated in June 1823. Nevertheless, Neves was elected deputy to the Côrtes of 1822. The years 1821-1828 saw the maturing of his political-economic development. Despite the ultra conservative approach to politics, Neves favored industrialization and free trade (while defending a moderate protectionism). As a result of his support for Miguelismo, Neves became an obscure figure after the liberals triumphed toward the end of his life. Today he is regarded as one of the most brilliant Portuguese thinkers and most lucid prose writers of his age—a precursor of modern economic theory in Portugal.

FIRST EDITION of a work containing much commentary on the Peninsula Wars. Also included are references to the Portuguese court at Rio de Janeiro, to campaigns in Austria, Germany, and Russia under Bonaparte, and to the author's service under Louis XVIII.

Martins Pamplona (1760-1832) a native of Angra, member of a titled family from that city on the island of Terceira in the Açores, served on the Black Sea under Romanzoff against the Ottomans in the Russo-Ottoman war of 1787-1791, receiving decorations for his valor. He fought under the Duke of York in the siege and taking of Valenciennes in the summer of 1793, and also campaigned in Roussillon from 1793 to 1795. Upon the dissolution of the Portuguese army after the French invasion led by Junot in 1807, he joined the Legião Portuguesa with the rank of colonel, serving at Salamanca, then in Germany and Austria, returning to Portugal in 1810 under Masséna, where for a while he was French military governor of Coimbra. In this pamphlet he defends himself and his wife against accusations of high treason for collusion with the French. Expelled from Portugal, he served with distinction in the Legião Portuguesa in Russia in 1812. Later he served in the French army under Louis XVIII at Gand, and was military governor of Loire et Cher in 1815. Remaining in exile in France until 1821, he returned to Portugal under amnesty, and was thereafter embroiled in the ongoing struggle between the Liberals and the Absolutists, on the side of the more conservative liberals. He had been created Barão de Pamplona by the French during his exile, at some point became a general officer, and was made Conde de Subserra by D. João VI in 1823, in appreciation of his help during the Vilafrancada. Holding various ministerial and ambassadorial posts, the Conde de Subserra was for a time effectively Prime Minister of Portugal under D. João VI. In 1827 he became a vegetarian, supporting animal rights. Dom Miguel had him arrested in 1828 and imprisoned in the Torre de Belem, then in São Julião da Barra and São Lourenço de Bugio. Finally he was transferred to the prison in the fortress of Graça in Elvas, where he died.



Early Azores printing of the Carta Constitucional, the second Portuguese constitution, a fundamental constitutional text for nineteenth-century Portugal, and one of the starting points of nineteenth-century Portuguese history, written and promulagated in Rio de Janeiro in 1826 by D. Pedro I, Emperor of Brazil, in his capacity as D. Pedro IV, King of Portugal. He then abdicated in favor of his daughter, D. Maria II. Sir Charles Stuart, Lord Stuart d'Rothsey, was charged with bringing the 1826 Charter from Brazil to Portugal in the year of its promulagation. Abrogated by D. Miguel in 1828, it was put back into force after the victory of the liberals under D. Pedro in August 1834, remaining the supreme law of the land until September 10, 1836. Closely resembling the 1824 Brazilian constitution, also in large part written by D. Pedro, it was the rallying point of the liberal cause which eventually resulted in the triumph of D. Pedro over his brother, the absolutist D. Miguel, bringing D. Pedro's daughter to the Portuguese throne as D. Maria II. Finally, under Costa Cabral, it was re-instituted on February 10, 1842, and remained the Portuguese constitution up to the fall of the monarchy in 1910. Though liberal in its day, it was more conservative than the first Portuguese constitution of 1822 or the third Portuguese constitution of 1838.

We know of no bibliography which accurately distinguishes the many editions of this fundamental work.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. The Vila de Oleiros is situated in the district of Castelo Branco, Beira Baixa. It has a long and interesting history, having produced a number of important native sons, among them Fr. Jorge Temudo, Bishop of Cochim and Archbishop of Goa, and Father António de Andrade, S.J., the first European to write about Tibet. The book contains a transcription of the letter written by Father Andrade to his Superior, dated November 8th 1624, narrating his trip to Tibet (pp. 329-58). There is a chapter on the ancient connection of the Vila to the Knights of Malta (pp. 48-58).

D. João Maria Pereira de Amaral e Pimentel (Oleiros, 1815 -Angra, 1889), 28th Bishop of Angra, governed his diocese from 1872 to 1889. He obtained a law degree from Coimbra University in 1849. Becoming a secular priest in 1850, he became secretary to the Bishop of Bragança, moving to Leiria in 1854. Elected Bishop of Macau in 1865-6, his nomination was rejected by the Portuguese government for political reasons. In 1884 he published the encyclical *Humanum genus* of Pope Leo XIII, which had been prohibited by the Portuguese government. A man of profound culture and learning, he founded the *Boletim Eclesiástico dos Açores*, today the oldest periodical publication in the Azores.

First and Only Edition in French. The original Portuguese version was published at Brest: Imp. de Rozais, 1829. It was signed in print on p. 11 by Rodrigo Pinto Pizarro. According to both Innocêncio and Canto, the French translation, issued anonymously, is considerably different from the original. Moreover, it must have been this French

translation, printed in Paris, rather than the Portuguese original, printed at Brest, which would have been used to lauch the public relations and diplomatic offensive resulting in the eventual successful accomplishment mentioned below.

After an introduction which occupies pp. [5]-9, most of the remaining pages contain correspondence, from 16 to 24 January, 1829, between João Carlos de Saldanha de Oliveira e Daun, 1.° Conde de Saldanha (the future Duque de Saldanha) and William Walpole, commander of the British Royal Navy squadron blockading the Açores. Saldanha had sailed from Plymouth intending to reinforce the liberals on the Island of Terceira loyal to D. Pedro I, Emperor of Brazil, and his daughter, D. Maria da Gloria, who had risen up against the absolute rule of D. Miguel I. Refused permission to land on Terceira, Saldanha was conveyed to the coast of Galicia, whence he made it to Brest, and then Paris. He was able to turn the failed mission into a diplomatic triumph, causing the British to relax their restrictions; shortly thereafter the Conde de Vila Flor was able to rearm the liberal resistance to D. Miguel on Terceira.

Pinto Pizarro (1788-1841), a native of Villar de Maçada (Villa-Real), was a member of the royal council, and a brigadier in the army. He lived in Brazil until 1822. A major figure among the partisans of D. Maria da Gloria during the 1828-1834 Portuguese civil war, he was elected to parliament in 1834 and 1837, received his title from D. Maria II in 1835, and was President of the Council of Ministers, Minister of War and of Foreign Relations from 18 April to 26 November 1839. This was the last purely *Setembrista* government.





The Casa dos Contos was the primary organ for regulation and fiscalization of state receipts and expenses. This document, with 127 chapters, provides insights into trading patterns, such as the importation of wheat to continental Portugal from the Azores, Madeira, Flanders and Brittany. Much attention is also paid to Portugal's overseas affairs, including considerable information concerning Africa, India and Brazil. Chapter 18 (p. 24) deals with Brazil. Chapters 39 (pp. 48-9), 40 (pp. 49-50), and 67 (pp. 81-2) deal with Africa. Chapter 8 (pp. 8-9) refers to the Azores, Madeira, and Africa. Chapter 94 (pp. 110-1) is about Cartas Geraes da India. Chapter 22 (pp. 28-9) contains references to the Casa da India and the Casa de Ceuta, while Chapter 46 (pp. 57-8) refers to the Casa da India. Chapter 41 (pp. 50-1) deals with the importation of wheat to Lisbon from the Azores and Madeira; Angra on the island of Terceira is mentioned specifically, as are the islands of Madeira and Porto Santo. Chapter 14 (pp. 19-20), "Do tempo em que os Officiaes de recebimento ham de vir dar conta aos Contos depois de terem acabado o porque foram providos," includes references to the Azores, Madeira, Porto Santo, Angola, Mina, Cabo Verde, and São Thomé.

Bell adds that he was "that rare thing in Portuguese literature, a poet who thinks" (p. 328). Born in Ponta Delgada in the Azores, he studied law at Coimbra from 1858 to 1864. He soon became a socialist, and after working in Paris and traveling in the United States, played an active part in the socialist movement in Lisbon. With the publication of such works as *Odas modernas*, 1865, *Primaveras românticas*, 1875 and *Sonetos*, 1881, he became one of the leading Portuguese poets of the nineteenth century. He retired to Vila do Conde in 1882, but never found peace of mind: nine years later he shot himself in a public square of Ponta Delgada.

He moved to Horta aged 2, and spent most of the rest of his life there, dedicating himself to journalism. Writing in the Romantic style, he was principal editor of the *Grémio literário*, in which collaborated most of the best Azores authors of the time.

The author mixes history, customs, folklore, biography, and anecdotes of life (mostly) on the Island of Faial. This is perhaps Rebello's most successful work; it is said by the author of the article about him in the *Dicionário cronológico de autores portugueses* to still make good reading today.

Ernesto [de Lacerda Lavallière] Rebello (Lisbon, 1842-Horta, 1890), erroneously considered by Ernesto do Canto to be a native of Faial, was the son of a Faialense father and French mother. He moved to Horta aged 2, and spent most of the rest of his life there, dedicating himself to journalism. Writing in the Romantic style, he was principal editor of the *Grémio literário*, in which collaborated most of the best Azores authors of the time.

Private Letters of the Barão de Rendufe to a Fellow Diplomat, the Visconde de Carreira: Apparently Unpublished

Collection of 16 letters from the Barão (later Conde) de Rendufe, a high-ranking diplomat, to the Visconde (later Conde) de Carreira, a friend and contemporary in a similar position, with frank comments on the Portuguese scene during the Lutas Liberaes and their aftermath, 1829-1846. Rendufe provides witty, energetic eyewitness accounts of military actions, debates in the Portuguese parliament, a society wedding, and much more.

By 1829, when the first letter of this collection was written, Simão da Silva Ferraz de Lima e Castro (1795-1857), Barão de Rendufe, was a rising star in the Portuguese diplomatic corps due to his dramatic actions during the battles between liberals and absolutists. In 1823, as *corregedor* for the Rossio neighborhood of Lisbon, Silva Ferraz supported D. Miguel in the Vilafrancada movement to overturn the Constitution of 1820. As a reward he was named intendant-general of police in Lisbon. Soon, however, his habit of mitigating the punishment of liberals earned him the enmity of D. Miguel and his mother, D. Carlota Joaquina.

In the Abrilada of 1824, when D. Miguel as commander-in-chief rebelled against D. João VI, Silva Ferraz suffered a mock execution and was thrown into prison after refusing

to provide information on discussions between D. João and foreign powers. Upon D. João's return, Silva Ferraz was named to the Conselho da Fazenda and elevated to the rank of Barão de Rendufe. Resigning from the police, he began his diplomatic career with a post to the Netherlands.

After D. Miguel usurped the crown in 1828, Rendufe traveled throughout Europe seeking support for D. Maria II. Two of the letters in this collection, written in London in 1829, are from this period.

Rendufe eventually sailed to the Azores to join the expeditionary force that D. Pedro was gathering to reinstate D. Maria II. The army landed at Mindelo, near Porto, in 1832. Porto was besieged by D. Miguel's forces for a year, during which time Rendufe was dispatched once again to gather support for D. Maria from other European nations. Seven letters in the collection date from this period, offering insights into the organization of the expeditionary force and a frank look at those who were in charge.

After D. Miguel was sent into exile, Rendufe was elected deputy to the Cortes. Three letters from Lisbon, dated 1834-1836, describe events in the capital and elsewhere in Portugal.

Rendufe continued to ascend the diplomatic ranks. From February 1842 to November 1845 he served as Minister Plenipotentiary to Berlin, and during part of this period (1844) he was also Portuguese representative to the court of Saxe-Coburg-Gotha, whose duke had married D. Maria II in 1836. He negotiated treaties of commerce and navigation with Prussia in 1844 and with several other German states in 1844 and 1845. When the Maria da Fonte movement broke out in April 1846, Rendufe was sent as minister plenipotentiary to Madrid. There he negotiated a treaty whereby the Spanish and English intervened to prevent D. Maria II from being deposed. A letter written in July 1846 from Madrid discusses uprisings in Vila Viçosa, Beira Alta, Minho, and Belém.

Rendufe's last diplomatic assignment was as Portuguese minister in Paris. Having retired in 1848, he married a wealthy Belgian noblewoman the following year. In 1852 he was elevated to the rank of Conde de Rendufe.

Rendufe's correspondent was Luiz de António Abreu e Lima (1787-1871), 1° Visconde and 1° Conde de Carreira. After serving in the army Abreu e Lima entered the diplomatic corps, with stints in London, Russia, and the Netherlands. D. Miguel dismissed him in 1828, but Abreu e Lima explained to the Dutch that he represented D. Maria, not D. Miguel. The queen's government in exile in the Azores sent him in 1830 as the queen's minister plenipotentiary in London. Abreu e Lima was named Visconde de Carreira by D. Maria in 1834. He was later tutor and chamberlain to the eldest sons of D. Maria II and D. Fernando II, the future kings of Portugal D. Pedro V and D. Luiz I. D. Luiz named him Conde de Carreira in 1862, in thanks for negotiating details of D. Luiz's marriage to D. Maria Pia de Saboia, princess of Sardinia and Piedmont.

The collection comprises 16 letters, of which the last 3 are incomplete. The contents are:

- 1. London, 8 June 1829. (4°, 1 l. text, 1 l. with address and remains of wax seal). Reports the news from the Azores (S. Miguel), mentions the involvement of Spain and other powers in the Lutas Liberaes.
- 2. London, 11 August 1829. (4°, 11.). Mentions that the Duke of Cumberland (fifth son of King George III, and eventually senior male-line descendant, who became King of Hanover in 1837) is gaining adherents.
- 3. Angra (Azores), 25 April 1832. (4°, 2 ll.). Mentions the blockade, the expeditionary force, and the Hymno Constitucional.
- 4. Ponta Delgada (Azores), 15 May 1832. (4°, 3 ll.). Complains of bad communication, mentions Mousinho (de Albuquerque) and the military situation in Terceira, and discusses at some length the organization of the *Exercito Libertador*. [The army landed near Porto in July.]
- 5. Porto, 21 July 1832. (4°, 2 ll.). A summary of the army's actions, with frank comments about various participants; mentions Trás-os-Montes and the Miguelistas in Braga.

- 6. Falmouth, 23 August 1832. (4°, 1 l.). Mentions a steamship that will be leaving soon, D. Miguel's navy, and Portuguese emigrants.
- 7. Porto, 20 September 1832. (8°, 2 II.). Mentions Almeida Garrett, the Visconde de Santa Marta, artillery, and forays. [This was during the siege of Porto by D. Miguel's army, which started in July 1832 and lasted about a year.]
- 8. Porto, 3 February 1833. (8°, 4 ll.). Mentions Lamego, Penafiel, a bombardment, and an attempt to persuade the Spanish government to refrain from a certain action. Several British names appear: Badcoc, Parker, Stratford, Canning.
- 9. N.p., 11 May 1833. (8°, 2 ll.). Mentions chronic shortages of gunpowder and troops, and the use of artillery.
- 10. Lisbon, 15 November 1834. (4°, 2 II.). A lively account of a 2-day parliamentary debate, with reports of who said what to whom, and mention of Leonel Tavarez and the Duque de Palmella. [By this point D. Pedro had died, D. Maria II assumed the throne, and the Duke of Palmella was her prime minister.]
- 11. Lisbon, 23 April 1836. (4°, 2 ll.). Mentions his sources of information, events in Valença, D. Maria II calling a Conselho d'Estado (a certain minister is condemned as a *traidor* and *o diabo a quatro*), Freire, and Carvalho.
- 12. Lisbon, 16 July 1836. (4°, 2 Il.). Mentions an attack on King Louis Philippe of France, the travels of D. Maria II and her consort, Carvalho choosing his cabinet, and the actions of the Câmara Municipal.
- 13. Madrid, 8 July 1846. (8°, 2 ll.). Mentions revolts in Vila Viçosa, Beira Alta, Minho, and Belém. [This became known as the Maria da Fonte movement.]
- 14. Paris, 22 August [no year]. (4°, 2 ll., LACKING at least 1 leaf at the end). Mentions the queen and Luis de Camara, Paraly-Barbosa, Francisco; includes anecdotes about someone's wedding.
- 15. LACKING at least one leaf at the beginning, with place and date. $(4^{\circ}, 1 \, l.)$. Mentions Aguiar as an enemy of the Duque de Palmella, Mo[u]zinho (de Albuquerque), the Marquês de Saldanha, the Conde de Villa Real and the Conde de Rio Maior.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. The satiric poet and journalist José Augusto da Costa Resende [or Rezende] was born in Ponta Delgada, 1849 and died there in 1896 on a straw bed in an overnight flophouse. He led a bohemian life, working for the Semana in 1869, later editing the Diário dos Açores, where is 1874 he sustained a prolonged and heated political fight. In 1875 he left this newspaper, founding the weekly Partido popular, iniciating a regionalist campaign. In 1880 he passed over to A ventosa, afterwards Ventosa sarjada, a newspaper featuring violent political prose and verse, alienating just about everyone who counted in the Azores. From there on it was all downhill. His state of mind near the end of his life is reflected in the preface to the present volume: "Comquando isto aqui em S. Miguel seja terra mais propicia á cultura de batata do que á das lettras, não abandono a carreira que sigo por vocação." The book is dedicated to the Visconde

da Palmeira, and begins with a brief biography of the dedicatee (pp. [7]-9). There are poems about or dedicated to Alice Moderno, Victor Hugo, Columbus, Ernesto do Canto, Camões, and the Conde de Jacome Corrêa. At the end of the volume (pp. [169]-183) is an essay giving a critical literary biography of Costa Resende, "Bocage açoriano" by F.[rancisco] M.[aria] Supico.

He transcribes various interesting documents dating from 1785 to 1817. In addition to royal edicts and decrees, instructions from royal ministers such as D. interned at the Civil Hospital and Maternity Hospice of that city. Nogueira Sampaio was also rector of the Lyceu de Angra.

Provenance: [José] Affonso Botelho d'Andrade [da Câmara e Castro] was a native of the Island of São Miguel and himself an author, contributing to a number of newspapers and journals, both in Lisbon and the Azores. He died at Ponta Delgada, 1887.

The author (1798-1895), was born aboard ship off Cabo Verde, and subsequently baptized in Rio de Janeiro; his parents were en route to Minas Gerais, where his father was going to take up a post as ouvidor in the Villa of Príncipe. The recipient of a law degree from Coimbra in 1820, he held a number of judicial appointments while writing various literary and political works during the 1820s, having been one of the founders in 1821 of the *Ocidadão literato, periodico de política e literatura*, Coimbra: Imprensa da Universidade. In political exile from 1828 to 1833, he was a deputy to the Portuguese Côrtes in various legislatures from 1834, and Minister of Justice and Ecclesiastical Affairs in 1852 and 1868. One of his greatest achievements was the *Código civil português*, commissioned by parliament in 1850, the finished product being presented in 1859. It was promulgated in 1867. A member of the Real Academia das Sciencias de Lisboa, he was created Visconde de Seabra in 1865, eventually serving as rector of Coimbra University (1866-1868). Throughout his life António Luís Seabra founded and wrote for several newspapers, and continued to publish books and pamphlets on legal, political, and literary matters.



Luz Soriano (1802-1891) pursued a distinguished career as a government official and historian, publishing several important works on the civil war in which he fought. He participated in the Revolução Constitucional in Porto, 1828, went into exile in England, returned for the Siege of Porto, and suffered political attacks during the ministries of the Marquês de Loulé, Visconde d'Athoguia, and Sá da Bandeira. He ends with a chapter on the "systema despotico" of the Portuguese government. The work includes a geographical description of the Azores that Luz Soriano published in 1832.

Provenance: Innocêncio Francisco da Silva (1810-1876) was the author of the first nine volumes of the monumental bio-bibliographical dictionary Dicionário bibliográfico português, 1858-1870 (often cited as "Innocêncio"). It has twice been reprinted and remains, a century and a half after volume I appeared, a standard and indispensable reference work. He ranks with Brunet, Graesse, Salvá, and Sabin as one of the foremost bibliographers of the nineteenth century. 

Second, greatly expanded edition of the first Portuguese bibliography to concentrate on material concerning Portuguese possessions overseas, including America. The first edition—a slim octavo of 151 pages, published Lisbon, 1797—described several hundred printed and manuscript works chronicling the history of Portugal and its possessions in Asia, Africa, America and the Atlantic. The second edition—a quarto of over 500 pages—is greatly improved, with many corrections as well as additions. Innocêncio found this work still useful when compiling his own Portuguese bibliography more than half a century later. FIRST and ONLY EDITION of what can be called the first attempt at a hydrological survey of Portugal. Over a half-century later, it was still the only such work of any significance, according to Rodrigues de Gusmão (as quoted by Innocêncio). The greater part of the first volume consists of an inventory of all known sources for mineral water within continental Portugal, as well as the Island of São Miguel in the Azores. Each source is carefully classified and located geographically. The book begins with a general consideration of the medicinal properties of water. It then discusses the properties of different waters, such as those which contain gas, are naturally warm, saline, or contain sulfur. Toward the end of the first volume is further discussion of waters with differing properties, how to examine and analyze them, more on the healthful qualities of water, and how to choose the most effective. There is a section of purification.

Tavares concludes that by far the best waters were those of Caldas da Rainha, which were already famous, with a number of books written about them in the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. The second volume is devoted entirely to the medicinal properties of the thermal waters of Caldas, what time of year to go there, diverse methods of application, and special dietary measures to be followed when at the spa.

The author, born in Coimbra after 1750, died in Lisbon, 1812. He was a physician on the Medical Faculty of the Universidade de Coimbra, primeiro medico da Real Camara,





FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Announces the defeat of the squadron sent by D. Miguel against Terceira in the Battle of Praia Bay, and reassures the inhabitants of the Azores of their safety and welfare under the legitimate government of D. Maria II. Fought by the coast of Terceira Island in the Azores on August 11, 1829, between Portuguese loyalists and a Miguelista fleet as part of the Portuguese civil war between the liberals, in the names of D. Pedro, former King of Portugal, at the time still reigning as Emperor D. Pedro I of Brazil and his daughter D. Maria II, in whose favor D. Pedro had relinquished his rights to the Portuguese throne, versus the absolutist forces of his younger brother, D. Miguel I. The Miguelistas under command of José António Azevedo e Lemos attempted to disembark troops on Terceira island, but were defeated by loyalist troops under command of the 7.° Conde de Vila Flor (later 1.° Marquês de Vila Flor and still later 1.° Duque da Terceira), who controlled a dozen small forts and artillery batteries along five kilometers of coast. The defeat of the absolutists in this battle was decisive for the affirmation and posterior victory of liberalism in Portugal. After the war, the municipality of Praia was renamed Praia da Vitória.

The text of this broadside does *not* appear in the report by Villa Flor printed in London by Bingham.

Marechal D. António José de Sousa Manuel de Meneses Severim de Noronha, 1.° Duque de Terceira, 1.° Marquês de Vila Flor, and 7.° Conde de Vila Flor (1792-1860) was a Portuguese military officer, statesman and a leader of the Constitutionalist side in the Liberal Wars, as well as four times Prime Minister of Portugal.



FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this comprehensive treatise on wine, wine making, and distillation, with additional sections on spirits and vinegar. The three copper engravings represent distilling and pressing equipment. The work concludes with a list of subscribers and a detailed table of contents. There are specific sections on methods of winemaking in Penafiel, Valença, Moncorvo, Bragança, Miranda, Coimbra, Alcobaça, Vila Viçosa, Elvas, and Ourem (pp. 148-54). There are also sections on how to imitate some of the best wines: Madeira (pp. 157-8); clarete (p. 159); muscatel (p. 160); and "geropiga, our vinho doce" (pp. 161-2). In the final section of lviii pp. are descriptions of wines from the Douro, Trás-os-Montes, Minho, suburbs of Porto, Penafiel, Basto, Ribeira do Lima, Ribeira do Minho, Comarca de Ourem in the Provincia da Estremadura, Vila de Borba, Algarve, as well as the Islands of S. Miguel, Fayal, and Pico in the Açores.

The author (Villarinho de São Romão, 1785-Lisbon, 1863), Peer of the Realm, and deputy to the 1821 Constitutional Côrtes from Trás-os Montes, later representing Vila Real and Bragança (before being elevated to the peerage by D. Maria II in 1835 after the restoration of the Liberal regime), served as administrator of the Casa da Moeda, and prefect of Trás-os-Montes and Estremadura. Landowner and economist, he was a member of the Academy of Sciences and numerous other learned societies as well as organizations devoted to the public good. During the reign of Dom Miguel he was forced to keep a low profile due to his progressive ideas, already expressed in some published writings, and later in many other published works. He was one of the most distinguished deputies from Trás-os-Montes to the early Portuguese parliaments, and one of the most important voices of liberalism in Portuguese parliamentary history.

FIRST EDITION of the fourth issue of the first periodical printed in Portugal. The *Gazeta* (sometimes referred to as the "Gazeta da Restauração") first appeared in November 1641, and was printed somewhat irregularly through September 1647, for a total of 37 issues. The *Gazeta* dealt primarily with the war between Spain and Portugal, but also covered foreign news and miscellany. Alexandre Herculano (quoted in Cunha) noted that it was "narrado com tal concisão e simplicidade, que seria de imitar pelos periodistas modernos."

The first 3 leaves in this issue offer news from Portugal, mostly skirmishes in the war with Spain, but also such snippets as the building of ships "a maneira das de Dunquerque" and a previously mute boy in Miranda who spoke and said, "Viva elRey Dom Ioam IIII." The foreign news (last three leaves) includes news of French troops sent to Catalunya, Spanish troops sent to Ilha Terceira, battles between the Protestants and Catholics in England, and battles, skirmishes, and diplomatic maneuvers in Flanders, Parma, and the Papal States.
