


In a Magnificent Binding By the Greatest Portuguese Bookbinder-Finisher of All Time

Large 8°, magnificent crimson morocco by David Caeiro, covers elaboratly gilt, with lyre at center, four Portuguese royal coats-of-arms near corners, much additional decororation within double ruled and decorated borders; spine richly gilt with raised bands in six compartments, first and bottom three with lyres and other gilt decoration, second compartment from head with short author-title gilt; third compartment from head with royal Portuguese arms amid much other gilt decoration; each compartment double ruled in gilt, bands milled gilt; place and date gilt near foot; inner dentelles gilt; marbled endleaves; top edges gilt, other edges uncut; sides of boards milled gilt. 
The opening essay by José Maria Rodrigues is "muito atenta e informada"—Pina Martins.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Following allegations of irregularities in the sale and distribution of olive oil, legislation was introduced to regulate its supply. Pages 15-19 deal with regulation of olive oil being imported from Italy, France and Spain.





FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this book which marks a turning point in the author's idealogical evolution.

Francisco de Barcelos Rolão Preto, (Gavião, 1893-Lisbon, 1977), was a Portuguese politician and journalist, one of the founders of Integralismo Lusitano, subsequently leader of the Portuguese Movimento Nacional-Sindicalista (MNS), a fascist organization. When in 1934 Salazar banned the Movimento Nacional-Sindicalista, Preto was briefly detained and later exiled. While in exile in Madrid, he was a guest in the home of José Antonio Primo de Rivera, with whom he collaborated in formulating a program for the Falange. On the eve of the Second World War he published a new edition of his work on Italian Fascism with high hopes for the Berlin-Rome axis. After World War II, Rolão Preto abandoned fascism and joined the left-wing Movimento de Unidade Democrática (MUD). In 1949 he participated in General Norton de Matos's 1949 presidential election

campaign. He also backed more liberal candidates for the Presidency, such as Quintão Meireles, Francisco Higino Craveiro Lopes, and, ultimately had a particularly important role as press manager in the 1958 campaign of another Salazar's opponents, General Humberto Delgado.

After the Revolution of April 25, 1974, with Gonçalo Ribeiro Telles, Henrique Barrilaro Ruas, João Camossa de Saldanha, Augusto Ferreira do Amaral, Luís Coimbra, among others, he founded the Partido Popular Monárquico (PPM). In 1994, Portuguese President Mário Soares granted him posthumously the Great Cross of the Order of Prince Henry the Navigator.


Provenance: Artur Morgado Ferreira dos Santos Silva (Porto, 1910-1980), Portuguese lawyer and politician. Active in opposition to the Estado Novo, he was a candidate for parliamentary deputy in 1957 and supported the presidential campaign of Humberto Delgado. He was one of the founders of the Partido Popular Democrático (later the PSD).

FIRST and ONLY EDITION—A COMPLETE RUN. Complete runs such as this one are difficult to obtain. *Quatro ventos* had contributions from Portuguese, Galician, Brazilian, Spanish and French writers, including José Régio, Vitorino Nemésio, Agustina Bessa Luís, David Mourão-Ferreira, Cecília Meireles, João Gaspar Simões, Eugénio de Andrade, Décio Pignatari, Haroldo de Campos, Augusto de Campos, Jacinto Prado Coelho, Leonardo Coimbra, Raul Leal, Saul Dias, Alceu de Amoroso Lima, Alberto de Serpa, António Manuel Couto Viana, António Rebordão Navarro, Armando Côrtes–Rodrigues, Duarte de Montalegre, pseud. [i.e. José Vitorino de Pina Martins], João Cabral de Melo Neto, Luís Forjaz Trigueiros and Manuel Anselmo. A poem in Spanish by Pablo Picasso appears in the second series, no. 11. Numbers 7 and 8/9 of the first series deal respectively with Galician culture and the new Brazilian poetry. An unpublished poem by Paul Valéry appears in number 13/14, a double issue devoted entirely to France. The journal was edited by Amândio César, Manuel Antunes, António Alvaro Dória, Arlindo Ribeiro da Cunha and Francisco Martins da Costa in Portugal; by Cyro Pimentel, Ilka Sanches

and Donatello Grieco in Brazil; and by Leandro Alvarellos, Ramon Otero Pedrayo and Sebastian M. Risco in Galicia. Artistic direction was provided by Roby Amorim; other artists who collaborated were António Quadros, Domingos Rebelo, Júlio, António de Azevedo, Fernando Lanhas and Martins da Costa.

In his groundbreaking *Dicionário das revistas literárias portuguesas do século XX*, Pires was uncertain about the number of issues in the first series, calling for "probably nine," but there are 14 in this set and in other sets we have handled. Regarding the second series, Pires, *op. cit.*, states that there are 14 numbers at the Biblioteca Nacional, Lisbon, the last dated July/December 1957. Our set has only 8 issues (as did the other sets we had), but number 7/8 is dated July/December 1960; this agrees with Lopes de Oliveira (*Imprensa bracarense*, p. 192), who states that the second series began in January/March 1959, and that the journal ceased publication with no. 7/8 of the second series, in July/December 1960. In his updated *Dicionário da imprensa periódica literária portuguesa do século XX*, Pires agrees with the number of issues in our set; he states that the Biblioteca Nacional in Lisbon lacks numbers 3 through 6 in the second series, and that the Biblioteca Geral da Universidade de Coimbra lacks the same numbers.


Regulations for Livestock in the Campo de Ourique Once Pasture Land Near to Lisbon Now a Densely Populated Part of Lisbon

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of these regulations regarding agriculture in the Campo de Ourique, presently part of Lisbon not far from the center of the city, at the time farmland. A large part of this *Regimento* deals with livestock: cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, and horses.

How to Grow Cinnamon Trees



FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this work on the cinnamon tree, written to accompany a consignment of them that D. João was having shipped to Brazil. The author relates the history of growing cinnamon, pepper, ginger and other spices and drugs in Brazil, citing Duarte Ribeiro de Macedo and P. António Vieira, among others. He then expounds more practical matters: uses for different parts of the cinnamon plant, type of soil and terrain necessary to grow it, etc.

Rodrigues attributes the work to Fr. José Mariano da Conceição Veloso (1742?-1811), a native of Minas Geraes and a noted botanist who published many other brief works on agricultural subjects, as well as the lengthy *Florae fluminenses*, 1790, an exhaustive study of Brazilian vegetation. Borba de Moraes and Innocêncio, however, do not list this among Veloso's works.

The *Memoria* probably dates after 1792, when D. João effectively replaced his mother D. Maria I, but before 1799, when he was officially named Prince Regent. The imprint, "com licença da Sua Magestade," suggests a date of 1797 or 1798: the Imprensa Nacional Catalogue cites this imprint as used only during those years (pp. 458-66).
